The assistance program was developed following the fire on January 23, 2014, at the Résidence du Havre in L'Isle-Verte, Québec.

This Red Cross assistance program was created to meet the needs of those affected by the L'Isle-Verte disaster, especially the most vulnerable individuals. A number of local partners and responders were interviewed to assess needs and an evaluation will continue in order to address other needs as they arise.

Red Cross assistance programs are designed to complement government aid and personal insurance coverage.

Administrative costs for the Red Cross and L'Isle-Verte Funds will not exceed 5%.
