

After enduring the largest evacuation in Canadian history due to wildfire in 2016, the people of Fort McMurray once again showed significant resiliency in the face of natural disaster – this time amid a global pandemic.

In late April, high water levels and river ice jams caused extensive flooding in northeastern Alberta. Entire communities in Fort McMurray, MacKenzie County, and the surrounding area were forced to evacuate.

The Canadian Red Cross was already on the ground and able to provide practical and emotional support to those forced to flee their home. Working in close partnership with the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo and other organizations, the Red Cross helped families meet basic needs such as emergency lodging, groceries and baby supplies.

Of course, with the threat of COVID-19 complicating matters, the Red Cross implemented protocols such as physical distancing and the use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to protect people in need and our responders.

Thanks to you, families in Fort McMurray, MacKenzie County, and the surrounding region did not have to face this flood alone. Your support also means that we can ensure that everyone affected has the support they need to recover from this disaster.

"It's been a hectic time in Fort McMurray because we're dealing with the pandemic, then we had the flood, and because of the flood many areas were under a boil water advisory too."
