Across Manitoba, the Canadian Red Cross is here, ready to help those who need it most.

The Canadian Red Cross is a non-profit humanitarian organization dedicated to improving the situation of vulnerable people at home and around the world.

What may be exceptional for most is typical for us. When disaster strikes, public safety comes first. Responding to a disaster can quickly deplete a community's resources. The Canadian Red Cross works with local authorities and other agencies to address the immediate needs of those affected.

Through a network of trained volunteers located across the province, the Canadian Red Cross can quickly respond to disasters wherever and whenever they strike – 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Personal Disasters

A personal disaster typically affects a single family. Examples include house fires or sewer backups. When personal disasters strike, the Canadian Red Cross in Manitoba may provide food, shelter, clothing and essential supplies for up to 72 hours. Blankets, stuffed animals, colouring books and referrals to other sources of assistance are also available.

Large Scale Disasters

A large scale disaster affects many families. Examples include tornados, forest fires or floods. Following large scale disasters, the Canadian Red Cross in Manitoba works with our disaster partners to provide for basic needs including: shelter; family reunification; assistance finding support; information; necessary supplies; food; as well as clothing.
