It has been three years since Nepal was rocked by a massive earthquake that had devastating effects. With over 600,000 homes reduced to rubble, health care facilities in ruins, crops destroyed, livestock decimated and infrastructure heavily damaged, the country was left to pick up the pieces. But since then, great strides have been made. The lives of those affected are no longer the same. Thanks to you, thousands of families now have a safe place to live and can access clean water through wells built in their own villages. They have regained sources of food and income as a result of more productive crops and livestock. And they have access to health care through facilities that have been rebuilt in the hardest-hit communities, including Dhunche, where a new hospital opened last December. Built with your support, the facility is an essential service for over 40,000 people living in one of the most isolated regions of the country.


The daily lives of these families have truly been forever changed by your support.

A new life for Kiran, Pratima and their young family



The day-to-day lives of Kiran, Pratima and their young son Rupesh changed a great deal after the earthquake in 2015. After sharing a temporary shelter with Kiran's parents for many months, the young family now lives in a brand-new two-room brick house that was built with your support.

Kiran, who received masonry training, helped rebuild a dozen homes in his community before the Red Cross recruited him to help supervise various construction projects underway in his village. For her part, Pratima helps provide for the well-being of her family by working as a seamstress at the local market.

Through your generosity, Kiran and Pratima were able to get their lives back on track. The recovery programs implemented by the Canadian Red Cross have helped many other families regain their independence and dignity.

A new place to find care



Immediate Lifesaving Assistance

- Clean water and sanitation facilities for communities
- Financial assistance to help families survive the winter (warm clothes, shelter materials, household items)

Field Hospital

- Deployment of hospital personnel (physicians, nurses, technicians)
