Rebuilding communities:

How your support is helping



Some of the worst-hit communities in Nepal were those in rural, remote areas. Many people here lost their homes as well as their livestock, an important source of income.

With your support, the Red Cross has been working alongside communities to help them regain critical access to clean water, sanitation, income, shelter, and health care.

And in doing so, we are not just rebuilding communities—we are working to strengthen them. That means homes are being rebuilt to withstand future earthquakes. Water systems are being reconstructed to bring clean water closer to more families. And farmers are being trained with techniques that make their crops more resistant and their livestock more productive.

By empowering communities to be safer and stronger, your support will be felt for many years into the future.

Patali Gurung lives in a rural village in Rasuwa district that was severely damaged. Patali and more than 400 others lost their homes. Since then, your support is helping people by providing cash grants to pay for construction as well as architects and engineers to ensure the structures are earthquake resistant. Patali's son also received training to become a mason and help rebuild homes in their community. "I feel good," says Patali. "I am happy that my son could build a house like this."

Lasting care: Your contribution to a safer and healthier Nepal

In the hardest-hit regions of Nepal, the earthquake reduced hospitals and clinics to rubble. As a result, many communities needed health support long after the immediate shock.

Today in Dhunche, the remote village where the Canadian Red Cross set up its emergency field hospital, your support continues to deliver vital care. Inside the hospital's tents, local health workers provide first aid, basic health care, health and nutrition information, basic pharmaceuticals, family planning resources, and maternal and child health services.

With your generosity, a health facility is also being constructed to replace the one that was severely damaged by the quake. This will ensure ongoing care for the community while a permanent hospital is built.

At the same time, you are not only rebuilding health care in Nepal—you are making it better.

In remote communities, reaching the nearest health facility has often meant a long, difficult walk through

mountainous terrain. Thanks to projects made possible by you, the Red Cross is working to change this reality by bringing health care closer to people in need.

Across Nepal, nearly 1,200 people in rural communities have been trained as first responders. They are now equipped with first aid skills that can mean the difference between life and death for someone injured in a remote area.

Your support has also been put towards training and equipping local health workers to be able to stabilize patients with serious injuries or trauma. In rural Nepal, where transferring critical cases to the nearest hospital can be long and challenging, these skills will save many lives.

Finally, your generosity is helping Nepal be ready for the future emergencies. By reusing equipment from the field hospital, the Nepal Red Cross is being equipped with its own emergency health clinic. This will enable a mobile health team to be deployed within 24 hours of an emergency, reaching the most remote areas of Nepal.





The cost of fundraising on this appeal will not exceed 5%. This includes fees associated with donation processing and receipting, reporting and communications.

Immediate Lifesaving Assistance

- First aid, medical care and emotional support for survivors
- Emergency relief items for households (blankets, tarpaulins, jerry cans, kitchen sets, hygiene items)
- Provision of clean water and sanitation facilities for communities
- Cash assistance to help families survive winter (warm clothes, shelter materials, household items)

Emergency Field Hospital

- Emergency field hospital (transportation, medical supplies and operating costs)
- Deployment of field hospital personnel (doctors, nurses, technicians)

Community Health Recovery and Livelihood Support

- Reconstruction of the health facility in Dhunche
- Strengthening community health care (training of local health workers)
