For nearly two years, the worst outbreak of Ebola in our history devastated the countries of Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone.

Families and communities were torn apart, the health system was pushed to the limit, and thousands of lives were taken.

From the onset, we knew that this was a fight that had to be won. But we also knew that we couldn't defeat Ebola on our own.

Thankfully, Canadians like you answered our call for donations. With your generosity, the Red Cross was able to recruit and mobilize thousands of local volunteers on the frontline. Your support also enabled the Canadian Red Cross to send 52 doctors, nurses and other specialized aid workers to assist.

With an unwavering commitment to help, Red Cross personnel and volunteers worked around the clock in difficult conditions to provide care and dignity to thousands of men, women and children affected by Ebola.

The fight against Ebola was long and challenging — just when the outbreak seemed to be slowing, it would flare up again. But after more than two years, our sustained effort has finally paid off.

"I HAVE PUT AWAY THE GLOVES, MASK AND GOWN — EBOLA IS OVER!"

When the call for help came, Garmai Sumo didn't hesitate to put her hand up. Ebola was spreading quickly, and her country Liberia needed her.

The 29-year-old woman joined thousands of Red Cross volunteers in the fight against Ebola.

"I was aware of the risk, but I was well trained," says Garmai. "We needed people to stop the virus."

The work of Garmai and her team was critical in breaking chains of transmission, though it was not an easy task. They encountered fear and distrust, stigma and violence. When others fled, they stayed on courageously.

"People were hostile, but we never gave up," says Garmai. "We explained to them, and explained to them again, in order to build trust."

For Garmai, the end of the Ebola outbreak is a big relief, even though she knows that the road to recovery will be long.

"I am happy to see my country stable, people driving cars, going to work and markets, returning to hospitals."
