

BUILDING TO BE DISASTER READY

B.C. Facts at a Glance 2012

- 72 disasters responded
- 10,146 clients served

Canadian Red Cross mission:

Over the last decade, the Southern Interior has endured natural disasters ranging from wildfires to landslides, flooding and major storms. Each time, we're reminded just how vulnerable we are.

Red Cross has the flexibility to work in concert with people affected, community agencies and all levels of government to ensure vulnerable individuals and families impacted by emergencies/disasters have what they need to get back on their feet.

This past year Red Cross has responded in Williams Lake, Sicamous, Westbridge, Johnson's Landing, Vernon, and Kelowna. We paid for moving expenses, damage deposits and rent for people needing temporary housing. We have replaced dentures, prosthetic limbs and hearing aids lost in apartment fires. We have replaced ruined refrigerators for families left for weeks without electricity due to fires, severe storms or floods. In the wake of a fire, Red Cross has replaced fire-burnt tools and equipment allowing tradespeople to get back to work. In Johnson's Landing, we provided building materials and funded specialized trades to help residents build a temporary water system in the wake of a landslide.

Red Cross House in Kelowna is the strategic base for growing the Red Cross network of trained volunteers. **Our goal is to double our volunteer base** from 500+ to 1,000+ over the next three years.

When disaster strikes, every second counts. Let's be ready!



BUILDING TO EDUCATE

B.C. Facts at a Glance 2012

- provided Swimming and Water Safety training to 237,408 participants.
- trained 82,593 people in First Aid.
- reaches more than 30,000 children and youth with its Violence and Abuse Prevention and Anti-bullying education programs each year.

We promote swimming and water safety through Red Cross instructor certification and course materials.

Our award-winning violence and abuse prevention education is comprehensive and includes programs like preventing bullying and relationship violence with a focus on youth peer-to-peer action and engagement.

Our goal is for Red Cross House to become a training centre where volunteers and the public can learn how to be safe from injury and respond during disasters.

BUILDING TO PROVIDE MOBILITY SOLUTIONS

The health equipment loan service helps disabled or injured children, youth, adults and seniors return from hospital sooner, stay at home longer or spend their final days in the comfort and security of their own home.

Red Cross House will be the central cleaning, repair and distribution hub for 33 volunteer–operated community equipment locations in the Southern Interior. **Our goal is to build our program to meet the increasing need for this service by expanding our service from half days to full days where possible.**
