Certifications are valid for three years. Certification will correspond to the candidate's completion of the pathway components and in accordance with the courses they wish to teach. This may include the following:

- First Responder Instructor (certified to teach BLS, AM, OT, MAFA, and FR)
- Emergency Medical Responder Instructor (certified to teach BLS, AM, OT, FR, EMR, AFA, and MAFA)
