

Your generosity at work Ukraine Humanitarian Crisis Update

December 31, 2022

Following eight years of conflict in Donbas, the past year of international armed conflict in Ukraine has left behind insurmountable suffering, death, and destruction. Since February 2022, nearly one-third of the people living in Ukraine have fled their homes, either to neighbouring countries or to other parts of the country. Those closer to the hostilities are facing daily challenges to protect themselves and their loved ones, while dealing with limited access to water, heat, health care and other essential services.

The Red Cross continues to work around the clock to respond to humanitarian needs in Ukraine and surrounding countries. The generosity of donors and support from the Government of Canada has helped reach people with vital aid in Ukraine and across Europe.

CANADIAN RED CROSS RESPONSE

Deployed **45** highly trained humanitarian experts to support the Red Cross Red Crescent Movement response on operations management, migration and displacement, cash assistance, health coordination, shelter and winterization, communications, and coordination of response efforts.

Provided more than **38,900** emergency relief items such as blankets, tarps and cooking supplies to Ukraine and neighbouring countries, thanks to support from the Government of Canada.

Provided funding for more than **6,700** primary healthcare consultations through Mobile Health Units during more than **350** community visits in Cherkasy Oblast, Ukraine, since August 2022. The teams are reaching people, including those displaced by the conflict, in remote areas where infrastructure has been damaged, and access to health care has been impacted negatively, to provide health assessments, medication, treatment for minor injuries, and referrals for additional care.

Provided funding for the salaries of up to **10** psychotherapists at the Lviv Regional Clinical Hospital in Lviv, Ukraine, due to the everincreasing mental health needs. Since October 2022, the team has provided **1,282** therapy sessions to **220** individuals which has contributed to improving the wellbeing of patients who have experienced traumatic events. The integration of mental health into a regular hospital setting is the first of its kind in Ukraine.

RED CROSS RED CRESCENT MOVEMENT COLLECTIVE RESPONSE IN UKRAINE AND SURROUNDING COUNTRIES, WITH SUPPORT FROM THE CANADIAN RED CROSS

Reached more than **14 million** people with e emergency relief items, including food, water, blankets and help accessing basic services. Distributed more than 199 million CHF (\$288 million ••• CAD) in multi-purpose cash assistance to support basic needs, rental assistance, health or shelter. Assisted more than 1 million people with health services. Provided shelter assistance to 1.8 million A people either through rehabilitation of existing structures or in temporary accommodations. Provided improved access to water for 10.5 million \bigtriangledown people and adequate heating to **1.4 million** people. Reached close to **3 million** people in Ukraine with hygiene supplies. Provided more than 328,000 people in Ukraine with mental health and psychosocial support.

- Assisted more than **252,000** people in Ukraine with transportation from conflict-impacted areas, including through safe and voluntary evacuations.
- Improved the living conditions of more than 160,000 people internally displaced by the conflict through assistance to collective centers providing temporary shelters and other essential services in Ukraine. This includes repairing damage to centers, assisting with renovations to accommodate increased needs, and providing supplies.
- Supported **170** health facilities in Ukraine with medical equipment, tools, and medication.
- Provided information about their loved ones, including prisoners of war, to **4,000** families.
- Mobilized more than **124,000** Red Cross volunteers and **59** Red Cross Red Crescent National Societies to meet the needs of those impacted.

UNDERSTANDING THE NUMBERS

Grand total of funds to date:

This includes the total funds donated, as well as the matching funds commitments of \$30 million thanks to the Government of Canada.

Allocation of funds to date:

This is the projected budget across each area of spending for the grand total. The allocations reflect the needs of the people and the communities that have been identified to date.

Spent and committed to date:

These are the funds that have been already spent to assist those impacted by the conflict, as well as funds that have been committed with authorized contracts or agreements for projects or initiatives, where applicable.

Cost of fundraising:

Fundraising costs are associated to the total funds donated to date (\$171.9M), not the grand total including funds received from the federal government. These costs can include donation processing fees; credit card and bank fees; service fees for call centres and digital platforms; technology costs; ongoing communications and reporting to donors. The cost of fundraising related to this emergency appeal will not exceed five per cent.
